Maude is the recipient of seven honorary doctorates as well as many awards, including the 2005 Right Livelihood Award (known as the "Alternative Nobel"), and the 2008 Canadian Environment Award. She is also the best selling author or co-author of 16 books, including the recently released *Blue Covenant: The Global Water Crisis and The Coming Battle for the Right to Water*.
